## THE PERSISTENT WIDOW — chapter 4, pp. 83-107 Luke 18:1-8 — the dynamics of justice in 3 sentences

- 1. This story is a parable told by Jesus. How does that influence your reading of it?
- 2. The parable is summarized before it's told a noteworthy, singular occurrence in the Bible. The summary is: Pray always. Is that summary adequate? Why might the writer of Luke chosen to offer this summary?
- 3. What is a widow like, usually? What do the role and characteristics of this particular widow tell us about the pursuit of justice?
- 4. What is a judge like, usually? What do the role and characteristics of this particular judge tell us about the pursuit of justice?
- 5. What other female protagonists in scripture come to mind, and how does this inform our reading?
- 6. The widow asks for justice against her "opponent." Does this word have any particular resonance or application to the pursuit of justice?
- 7. Verse 5 has some textual variants that may be significant, as they suggest that the widow could give the judge "a black eye." What is significant about a black eye?
- 8. What is the judge's reason for granting the widow's request? Is this surprising or unsurprising?
- 9. Think about what you know about Jesus' parables. In what ways is this typical or atypical?
- 10. How does this story help us understand the dynamics of power in a patriarchal system?
